The second one represents the human plane qi, and the third one represents the Earth qi (inside the earth that is Juddisim,a religion that focuses on wisdom instead of God, also groups its philosophical elements in threes, like the Three Gems (Buddha, Dharma, Sangha), the Three Roots called Trikaya, the Three Vajras.And of course, there is the Trinity from Christianity, which states that God is a single being who exists simultaneously and eternally as three persons; the father, the son and the holy spirit.
