And most experts have definite opinions about which way is the best. Many people use traditional screen-printing, which involves pushing ink through a mesh screen to transfer an image onto a shirt. One newer technique is "direct to garment" printing, in which a large inkjet printer prints the image directly on the tees. "It doesn't make much difference how you do it," says Peter Rinnig, owner of QRST's, a T-shirt printer in the Boston area. "Just research what's best and most cost-effective for you." John Earle has always stuck with traditional screen-printing for Johnny Cupcakes, a T-shirt company in Hull, Massachusetts, and he has no complaints. "It's been around the longest and is the most reliable," he says, "although this year, I plan on testing out a few new methods--dye, enzyme washes, cut and sew, embroidery, direct-to-garment printing and more."
