Safe products. gov Back in late June, we spent a few weeks testing an entire herb eater barn gas for our Best String Trimmer Shooting. We have looked at the trimmers performance, efficiency, characteristics, ergonomics and value to see which model has presented the most suitable for the landscape; needs. And while we found some options that would make every Pro happy, we also found a models that are probably best suited to the residential/do-it-yourself sector of the trimmer market. That said, today we are looking at the TB6044 XP Troy-Bilt 4 Stroke Weed Eater. He ended up in the last spot of our shootout. This might sound a little unflattering, but keep in mind that Troy-Bilt’s demographic target is not really the Pro market. The brand aims to make equipment for the owner of a DIY home who is not looking to spend an arm and a leg to take care of their lawn, but who also needs a reliable tool. That being so, let’s take a look at our finisher in tenth place.ErgonomicsAlthough it does not contain everything we are looking for in determining an ergonomic score, the weight of a tool plays an important role. Of course, the rope trimmer requires you to carry it around the yard with you, usually, for a considerable amount of time, so a lighter tool is a more comfortable tool. While the vast majority of the rope trimmers we looked at weighed somewhere around the 12-13 lb mark, the Troy-Bilt 4 punches Weed Eater in a bulky 14 lbs, 9 ounces. Only one other model we examined weighed more.We also considered noise, because a quieter cutting experience makes it more comfortable. Unfortunately, Troy-Bilt’s model sounded loud and clear. In our ear we measured this trimmer at 102 dB (A). At 50 feet away, it measured 77 dB (A). It didn’t scream at us as much as the Stihl model, but don’t be under any illusions: the Troy-Bilt 4 Stroke is a bit painful from a noise point of view. In the end, he finished ninth in our sound tests.In addition, from a purely tactile point of view, we have already encountered trimmer strings more comfortable. One of the main problems we encountered with this model revolved around the safety of the accelerator, which A little sketchy. Basically, if you don’t press it hard in some areas, it won’t unlock the accelerator. We also thought that Troy-Bilt could have made the tree on the XP a little longer. Some of us in the office are over six degrees high, and having to bend over to get any work done can get a real painful real quick. Fuel efficiency, we have some good news and some bad news about TB6044 XP’Fuel efficiency. I’ll start with the bad news first: the herb eater at four troy-bilt times only works for just over thirty minutes on a full tank. Generally like to see a pro-level rope trimmer squeeze at least 45 minutes on a tank, but this has ended up in the last place with the shortest time with the shortest runtime time: 31: 03. However, the good news is that, despite the TB4066 XP S Short runtime, this trimmer tightens bound for the first place for effective fuel efficiency. See, the problem is that the fuel tank on this model is only 11 oz. Most of the trimmers we tested had fuel tanks in the 20-Oz region, which allowed them to operate much longer on a complete tank. But if you break the runtime based on oncia, Troy-bilt makes a very efficient model here. Unfortunately, to use this trimmer commercially, you will spend more time than it is reasonable to return to the truck for refuelling. For this reason, we cannot give the four-time herbivore of Bilt Troy-Bilt as Stellarar a score as we would like to keep everything right in our shooting, we have used Trufuel Premix and 4-cycle fuel throughout the cycle of our string trimmers. Crude fuel “Trufuel Premix and the category SetThis 4-cycle FUFELFATURE presents something of a mixed bag for us. On the one hand, the herbivore of 4-time bilt troy has a good amount of functionality that work for this, but on the other hand, most of those features are not really what we are looking for on a commercial model. By request, the XP has a 4-time engine that does not require premix. It also has a divided tree that allows the user to attach different heads. It also has the capability of Jumpstart, which allows the user to activate the herb eater with a separate electric start adapter. Our problem here is that the Troy-Bilt lacks a serious head, Auto Choke, Choke, Feature and primer bulb. The line filling system is OK, but a ratchet filling system would be better. It’s got a straight tree, but it comes in two parts. We prefer a one-piece shaft for the life of the asset. It has a 3-year warranty, but not a commercial warranty. To give credit where it is due, the 4-stroke troy-bilt herb eater behaves well with his swath cut to 16 8” ~. It didn’t win our speed tests, but it came out right in the middle of the package with the most pro-level models. Its average cutting time in typical grass was 8.8 seconds and 13.6 seconds in the foliage most often. Unfortunately, after finishing the tests, we noticed that the fat had started to lose its head. We realize that this might be a one-time, one-off kind of thing, but it doesn’t inspire much confidence about the tool’s life span. We thought we should mention it. For all the string trimmers in our shootout, we used. 095 Echo Black Diamond Trimmer Lines.Valuethe Troy-Bilt 4 times Germany for \$ 239. Aside from the two Ryobi models we tested, the TB6044 XP was the cheapest model we had. At nominal value, this looks like a good deal. However, keep in mind that while the TB6044 XP comes with a 3-year limited warranty, the warranty does not cover commercial use. The bottom line would be difficult for usthe TB6044 XP to the professional gardener who has to rely on his equipment every day. This model lacks a lot of the features a pro should look for, and while its fuel efficiency is quite large, it’s small fuel tank won’t allow it to operate long enough to be considered a viable option for commercial use. In addition, Troy-Bilt does not guarantee the commercially available product. In itself, this fact indicates that Troy-Bilt pointed this model at the homeowner. That said, the “Troy-Bilt 4” eats grass makes some sense for the DIY market. The cutting sample and performance look good, and it has accessories available that should open this tool up to a variety of applications. A fat loss gives us some concerns about the initial quality, but with that three-year consumption guarantee, this string trimmer should be~128;t be too much of a bet.
