Can't play local files on spotify mobile

CAUTION - THIS PAGE IS PROBABLY NOW OUT-OF-DATE Paul Brown recently wrote a great article on Why Spotify is an iTunes-killer worth paying for. In it, he mentions that you can sync your local music with Spotify on your mobile. This feature's been around in Spotify for a while now but it seems that not everyone was aware of it. Instead of having to use cables or manually copy files to your phone, Spotify can sync them for you via WiFi. So to complement Paul's article, here's an expanded How To Guide. NOTE: since this article was written, Spotify updated their app to make it easier to sync (see the comments below). Basically you should now see you smartphone/iPod appear in the new Devices section in Spotify desktop. You can then just tick the playlists you want to sync, or make Spotify sync everything. . 1: Import to Library First of all, if you've not already done so you need to import the MP3s you want to sync into the Spotify Library: Start Spotify on your desktop. Click the Library link then follow the instructions to import the MP3s into Spotify. You can browse to a folder to import or simply drag-and-drop the music files into the the Library's Local Files view. . 2: Create Playlist Create a new playlist then drag the tracks you want to sync from the Local Files area into the playlist. You might want to create one playlist per album, a "New Tracks 2011" playlist, or one big playlist with all your local music. For example, here's a playlist for the Arcade Fire album The Suburbs. . 3: Connect Phone and Sync Now make sure your phone is connected via WiFi to the same network as your PC (this step is important: you can't sync local files over 3G). Also make sure Spotify is still open on the desktop, otherwise the files won't sync. Start Spotify on your mobile. Click Edit Offline Playlists then locate the new playlist(s) you created earlier. Tick them to start the offline syncing. The local files from your PC are then downloaded to your mobile. . As you add or remove local files to these playlists on the desktop, the mobile version keeps in sync with the changes. So in three easy steps, I now have Arcade Fire on Spotify Mobile! . MENU 4. Import your local files with the "Desktop" steps. 1. 5. Make sure both your computer and your mobile device are hooked up to the same Wi-Fi connection, syncing these files across to your work PC would involve moving it externally (ie. With the folder added, any non-DRM restricted music contained within will be immediately imported into the Spotify library, found under the "Local Files" tab in the main menu tree. Click New Playlist in the Spotify app on your computer. Share iTunes Library File. Then your iPhone or Android phone will show up on the "Devices" tab. There is no more 'Import iTunes' function, instead they launched a new feature 'Local Files' to sync iTunes music, downloaded music and music library to Spotify. Step 5 Sync the Converted Spotify Music to Android device. If it is the first time to sync iPod with Spotify, the current files will be erased, so make sure these files are back-up before syncing. Download the playlist with your local files. Open Spotify on your computer and create a playlist that contains the local tracks you want to sync. Just Launch your Spotify and go to Preferences first. Spotify has removed the top menu to import playlist from iTunes. Now, click on ADD A SOURCE and select the folder with music you want to add to your Spotify app. 2. On desktop, import your local files (with the "Desktop" steps). Switch off any sources you don't want. Now head over to Local Files, where you should find all of the music in your iTunes library. Note: You need to allow Spotify to find devices in the prompt that shows. How to Add Local Music to Spotify . The only way local files get synced from your computer to your phone is if on your phone you toggle the "Download" option on the playlist they're on. (Make sure you're on the same Wi-Fi network) You can either choose Sync all music to this device or Manually choose playlists to sync to manage specific playlists for syncing. Spotify... On your mobile device, open Spotify. Step 4. Whenever I add a local file to my Spotify playlists, then it won't sync to my mobile device (Galaxy Note 4, Android). The Spotify app for iPhone can sync and play your personal music files, but making it happen isn't obvious. Step 3: Scroll down to the Local Files menu and ... Click on the Spotify playlists you want to sync to Android for offline listening. Log in on your mobile or tablet using the same Wi-Fi as your desktop. Step 1. Step 2: Open the app and tap on the Spotify in the menu bar, and open Preferences. Go to Settings -> Local Files and switch on Enable sync ... Any other folders can be added by going into Preferences, scrolling down to "Local Files" and clicking "Add a Source", near the bottom. Spotify stores some information about your local files in the Spotify folder folder called local-files.bnk and here's how to find it: 1. close your Spotify client and open your Windows Explorer (file browser) 2. type %appdata% to the window, it will take you to Appdata/Roaming 3. Navigate to Spotify folder. Connect your iPhone X to iTunes, and click on the device icon, then you will enter your device info page, simply click on Music option. Go to Settings > Local Files and switch on Local audio files. In the Account Settings, scroll down to Local Files Section. First of all, we will have to import local music to Spotify desktop application. 3. Didn't work? Make sure that both your iPhone and your computer are connected to the same wifi network. Streaming music is what most people do nowadays, but local files can help fill in the gaps and pull from a library you spent years curating. Method 2: Download iTunes Songs and Transfer to Spotify (Device & PC) Part 1: Permanently Download iTunes Library, Playlists & Songs to Local. Step 2: Open Spotify & Go to Local Files. First, follow steps 1-11 above to import local music files on your computer. Step 6. The device now appears on your computer below Devices in the Spotify window's left sidebar. Click on "Sync 'device's name' with Spotify". And then, you can refer to the detailed guide to add local files to Spotify library. (Windows users can find it under Edit, while Mac users can find it under Spotify .) If they're part of a larger playlist you don't want completely downloaded, you can make a new playlists with only your local files you want to sync, and then on the phone toggle that playlist to download, and your local files will be available to play no ... ON YOUR IPHONE You will see the new "Local Files" playlist appear. Step 3. Then it will start syncing automatically. ON YOUR MACBOOK: So you have your local files that appear on Spotify. Step 1. Learn more. Please follow the steps to import iTunes library to Spotify. Previously, Spotify owned the function of importing iTunes Playlist to Spotify directly (File >> Import Playlists >> iTunes), but they just cancelled this function in 2018. 2 years ago. Firstly, you will need to attach the Music Playlist local folder on Spotify. Or you can directly go to Spotify, find the songs you want to convert, hit the button" ... " to paste the song link to the search bar, and click " Add ". Other tracks on Spotify's servers sync fine, though. In my three-ish years of using Spotify, I've used various jailbreak tweaks on my iPhone like the original BdaySpotify tweak which allowed you to have full premium features and do the above task easily. Part 2: Sync Downloaded iTunes Library, Playlists & Songs to Spotify. 2.2 Sync Spotify Songs to Apple Watch for Playing. Fortunately, Spotify offers an option for users to import local files to Spotify library on your computer. As result, you can freely play not only Spotify tracks but also your own music files on Spotify desktop and mobile app. Otherwise, you could locate the folder for saving Spotify music files by clicking Search icon. Method 2. Log in on your mobile or tablet using the same WiFi as your desktop. Here, we will teach you how to do it using your iPhone or Android phone. Next, you can click the button "Manually choose playlists to sync". 2. Step 3 Click the "Erase your iPod & Sync this iPod with Spotify" option. Now all Spotify songs are converted and unprotected. That's to say, you are able to add iTunes playlist to Spotify from your local computer. Actually, you can't have the uploading of local files done directly via your iPhone. How to add songs to Spotify? I already tried contacting Spotify customer support but they were no help, all they did was offer ... Well, what to do then?Since Spotify allows its users to play offline music from its desktop app, they can just download their music from other sources and play it in the Spotify desktop app and then the user can also sync with their phones if both devices are on the same wifi.But it's not so easy as it sounds, as it has been causing many problems amongst users such as the Spotify waiting to download error or as here we have the local files not showing on Spotify. This local files not showing up error is being primarily seen in the Android and iPhone mobile apps but some claim to be unable to access local files on the Spotify desktop app as well.The primary reason for local files not showing up on the Android or the iPhone mobile app is the firewall settings on the Windows or Mac device where the local files are stored. Here's how you can fix local files not showing in Spotify on phone -1. Change firewall settingsBefore you mess around with your firewall settings on your laptop or computer, you need to ensure that both your mobile phone and computer are on the same wifi network. If the computer is connected with an ethernet cable, then remove it and connect it with wifi. This is a very important step and should not be missed.Here are the next steps to follow after you have ensured that both devices are on the same wifi network -Open the Control panel and look for 'Windows Defender Firewall', change the view option to 'Large icons' if only a handful of options are visible.Follow these instructionsAfter you have entered the firewall settings, look for 'Allow an app or feature through Windows Defender Firewall' at the left pane and click on it after you have found it.Click on this oneThen click on the 'Change Settings' button and scroll through the list of apps and features and try to find Spotify or spotify.exe.Click on 'Change Settings' buttonIf you are unable to find Spotify, then click on the 'Allow another app' button below and navigate to the location where the Spotify app is installed and from there select the exe file of Spotify. You can easily look up the installation directory of Spotify by going to your desktop and then right-clicking on the Spotify shortcut and clicking on 'Open file location' and it will show the directory where the spotify.exe file is located.Click on Allow Another app and then look for SpotifyAfter that tick both the public and private options and then click on the OK button below. This will save your settings and now give your computer and phone a restart and check if you still get the waiting to download error:Tick the both Public and Private and then click on ok.If you are using any antivirus on your system, then you will have to disable the firewall inside that too or add Spotify as an exception in it as you did in the windows firewall. You can easily go to the help section of your antivirus to figure out how to do that.After you have done that give your apps a restart both on your phone and your computer and then try to access your local files on the Spotify mobile app again.2. Clear cache & reinstallAbove we showed you how to deal with local files not showing up on your phone but what to do if they are not showing on your desktop Spotify app, thee very place from where you added them in Spotify.Uninstalling the Spotify app and then clearing its cache and then reinstalling solves most of the problems with Spotify desktop app. Unfortunately, this is a pretty tedious task and requires expertise or a lot of third-party apps. But there is one app known as IOBit Uninstaller, which does all the jobs.Simply download and install IObit Uninstaller and then install it by following the on-screen instructions.Then open up the app and under 'All Programs' look for Spotify.Click on the green dustbin icon beside it, to uninstall the app.Click on the green dustbin iconThen a new sub-window opens up, under that tick the option 'Automatically remove residual files' and then click on the Uninstall button. The Spotify app will be successfully uninstalled and all data and cache created by the app will also be deleted.Now that you have successfully uninstalled and cleared the cache of the Spotify app simultaneously, now its time to download the latest version of Spotify. Download it and then install it and then log in to the app.Now go on to the settings and turn on the 'Show Local files' option and then set the location of your mp3 files. And then check if all your local mp3 files are showing inside Spotify or not.3. Delete Local-files.bnkSpotify stores the location of your local music files in this file named as local-files.bnk. Deleting it often fixes the local files not showing problem. Here is how you can find the file and then delete it -First, open the Spotify app and go to your account settings from the top right corner.Then scroll down and uncheck all the local files locations.Then close down and exit the Spotify app from the notification tray.Uncheck all those locationsNext head over to 'C:\Users*USERNAME*\AppData\Roaming\Spotify\Users*****#\#-user\' and there you will see the file 'local-files.bnk'. Delete it and then reopen the Spotify app and then add your music library locations again in the Spotify settings to show the local music files.Your local files should show up inside Spotify now.4. Move around your local filesIn order to make Spotify refresh its local files list, you could simply move your local files and then again put them back in the same location. When you perform this action Spotify will sense it and it would refresh its local files list. Here are the steps to do that -First, copy all your music locals files and back them up in a different location.Then delete all the music files from the original location.Then go to your backup copy the files and paste them back in its original location. This should force Spotify to refresh its local files list and by now Spotify should be showing all your local music files inside the app.5. Convert files to proper MP3 formatMaybe your music files are in some other file format than the ones which are supported by Spotify? Spotify only supports .mp3, .m4p(unless it contains video) & mp4(if QuickTime is installed on your computer). Unless your music files are in these formats you won't be able to play music or it won't even show up in the Spotify local files list.Try using media converters to convert your files into mp3 or into any other supported formats. You can use online sites like Online Audio Converter or offline applications like Total Audio Converter to bulk convert your audio into supported formats if you have too many files. Convert those files and then copy the converted files to your library which is added in Spotify settings as the source and then see if the local converted files are being shown inside Spotify just beware that sometimes you might see that Spotify keeps pausing, just be alert as this could lead to the local files not showing problem.Summary
