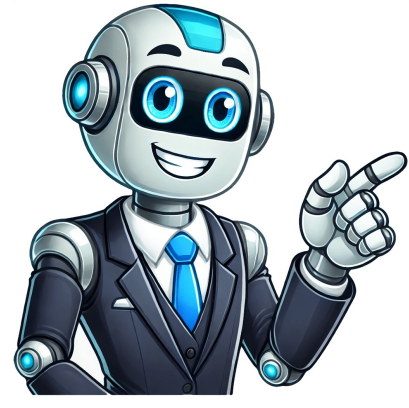

Then, release both keys and type the letter that you want to accent. For the ñ, hold down the Option/Alt key while you press the n key, then press n again. To type an umlaut over the u, hold down the Option/Alt key while pressing the u key, then press u again. To type ÿ, press the Option/Alt key and the y key. To type ç, press the Option/Alt key, Shift, and the c key. Full Keyboard Configuration For those using Spanish letters and punctuation on a regular basis, we recommend going into your Control Panel/System Preferences and adding the Spanish keyboard configuration. This will mean you need to learn the new key placements, but it is very easy once you get used to it.Looking forward to seeing everyone at the meeting tomorrow and discussing our strategies. To set up your Spanish keyboard on a Mac, follow these steps: Go to System Preferences > International > Input Menu. Scroll down and select "Spanish - ISO" or show the input menu in the menu bar to choose which keyboard you want to use. For example, if you install a Spanish keyboard, it might react differently than what you're used to. Here are some key shortcuts for typing punctuation marks: type an apostrophe by pressing the key next to the number 0, press Shift and then that same key to type a question mark, or press Shift and the key after the number 2 to type double quotes. It's easy to get started with the Spanish alphabet, which has 27 letters, including the letter "ñ". You'll notice many of these letters have their own special names, so you can use them correctly in everyday writing.
