He stated that in February 1993, he attempted to take his life with valiums, and it was a difficult period in his life. However, he clarified that the song "A Tout Le Monde" is not about suicide, but rather about finding closure and saying goodbye to loved ones before they pass away. Mustaine explained that the song's title is French for "to all the world," and it's about him wishing to say goodbye to everyone he loves. He wanted to convey a message of love and appreciation to those around him, especially his mother, who passed away. The band's lead vocalist added that they do not write music that promotes or glorifies suicide. The song was released as part of Megadeth's album "Youthanasia" in 1994, which sold over 1 million copies in the United States. Despite its commercial success, the band struggled to match Metallica's sales figures. However, they were pioneers in the internet age, launching a website in October 1994 to promote their album. The phrase "tout le monde" is French for "everybody" or "everyone," and it conjugates with the third-person singular form. It has its roots in other Romantic languages, such as Spanish's "todo el mundo."
