No problems were encountered. Purchased a 2023 Expedition and made the same trip to North California. It seems like each day of travel something wrong was found. After return home a list of problems were documented. The water heater turned on but wouldn't stay on. It leaked in a heavy thunder storm, not a small leak but had to use a towel to slow the leak. Numerous screws and fasteners for stove top, cabinets and wood framework stripped out. A/C struggled to cool. The cassette toilet is not leak proof and would detach from its mounting. Need to make sure at each stop to reach it. Wire harness underneath would rub against it. It does trailer nice behind vehicle and easy to maneuver. Overall disappointed with no quality. This was the worst purchase we've ever made. From year 1 (2020) it's been nothing but problems. Every year since we purchased it every time we try to take it out for an adventure there's something wrong with it. We've had electrical problems, water problems, window problems and leakage problems. In my opinion it's poorly built. Currently we're experiencing two electrical issues, 1) if we try to use the electric option for the refrigerator and have the trailer plugged into household current it blows our house circuit breaker, 2) when we turn the switch on for the water pump to use the water tank the fuse in the trailer blows.
