Example - I have worked here since 2010, can also be expressed like - I worked here in 2010. Knowing how to rewrite sentences so that they have the same meaning as the original is often required for many English language tests like TOEFL examination or English ESL EFL Exams such as Cambridge's First Certificate, CAE and Proficiency. Sentence Transformation is also an important skill which can help in improve our understanding of similar English expressions and vocabulary.
