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User Summary: The 1st and the second press of this manual contained the Mythos of Cthulhu and Elric (Melniboneean). The 2A-4th Stamples contain a choose thanks to the use of the material, although the material has been removed after the second press due to a copyright controversy of the intellectual property. Onset according to Frank Mentzer in Gencon Socal 2003, the stamunges of this book have been indicated internally to TSR as follows: 1a Print: calamari, no thanks! 2nd print: calamari, with thank you! 3 Å ° and 4 Å ° Prints: no squid, thank you! (3 Å ° Logo Wizard, 4th has the face logo) Later Print: no squid, no thanks! Further comments on this aspect of the book can be found at: Diegies & Demigods has enjoyed numerous prints. Interested parties to previous stamunners should definitely consult expert resources when buying or specific survey, early printers. The 1st-4th Stamples (dietetic and demigods entitled) present the "old" coverage of Erol Otus; The fifth and subsequent print (entitled Legends & Lore) present the "new" coverage by Jeff Easley. 1a Print, 1980, contains 17 Pantheon in 144 pages; Wizard TSR Logo Second Print, 1980, contains 17 Pantheon in 144 pages with "Special thanks ..." Comment on page 4; Wizard TSR Logo 3rd Printing, 1980, contains 15 Pantheons (back cover still says 17) in 128 pages with "special thanks ..." Comment on page 4; Wizard TSR Logo 4th Printing, 1981, contains 15 Pantheon in 128 pages (Rear Cover now says 15); Face TSR Logo - The first versions retain the comment "Special thanks ...", subsequent versions do not do so; The background color of the cover on this print is moved from the purple to the 5th Blue Print, 1984 (on the first page) and 1983 (rear cover). Ritituted Legends & Lore - otherwise identical content to the fourth print 6a print, December 1987 - Identified on the copyright 7A print page, April 1988 - Identified on copyright Page 8a Print, April 1990 - Identified on the copyright page The exhaustive information can be found at: deities.html Any old RPG material collector will tell you one of the Å ¢ Å Å "Holy GraealsÅ ¢ Å,~ is one of the first divinity and Demigods (DDG) from 1980. It is not only for Dungeons & Dragons Aficionados, but also to HP fans Mythos of Mythos and Mythos of Michael Moorcock (not to mention the world of Fritz Leiber, Nehwon, at home of the largest sword duo of all time: Fafhrd & The Gray Mouser). This is because the first edition (actually, the first print of the first edition) presented Gods and characters from all three Pantheons. The successive editions dropped the first two for legal reasons. A first edition of this coveted Tome has just been for \$ 56.98 (more 5.95 shipping) on eBay after 17 offers. The winning bidder was probably ecstatic, because I saw them go for much more (I paid more for one myself). But if you start browsing the ads, we soon note many first editions offered by twenty years. What do you? As with the same as, when it comes to DDG, not all the first editions are the same. The Pantheons Cthulhu and Melnibonei were pulled to halfway through the press printing of the edition Å ¢ Å,~ Å "First" (which launches the normal meaning of the first edition in the shredder, but no matter). The best typ- OFF is the number of pages. What you want has 144 pages; subsequent machines have 128. Some sellers advertise to have a bona fide edition "and edition or containing Å ¢ Å,~ Å" Chaosio thanks, Å ¢ Å,~, but these are not veridicity indicators. That's why. And this becomes a bit twisted. The most likely explanation is the 1st and the 2 Å ° actually is the same print. It has been said that the first press has been stopped at half road and thank you entered (by order by Brian Blume no less). This is further detailed here. Frank Mentzer implied that there were only four prints in the discussion in Gencon Socal, but did not say so a way or the other directly. Unpacking that the terminology used informally to TSR to refer to the various prints, Å ¢ Å,~ Å "SquestÅ ¢ Å,~ indicates that the Pantheon of Cthulhu was here I'm. The first copies to launch the presses did not have a recognition (Å ¢ Å,~ Å "Squids, no thanks! Å, Å,~) because TSR erroneously thought that Lovecraft's work was in the public domain. Maorcolck could have considered him quite flattering that his creations were incorporated into the game Dungeons & Dragons, and apparently was not all that concerned the ins and the copyright outs (things were much more informal in those days of Halcyon of Yore, before everything She was bought by blood mega-corporations). Unfortunately, he had extended the same courtesy to the people of chaosh games, who had their own material based on Melnibone in the works, and made a little more than their great competitor was drawing on the same source material. They were also launching his game of Lovecraftan, the famous Cthulhu call, for which they had guaranteed the legal rights of the property of Lovecraft. So here is TSR horning in their licensed products. In what is a shocking one for our current day and a figurative idea (when, for example, such disputes on the license property have potential future dungeons & dragons films linked in legal limbo), the chaos has given a Nod of approval to move forward with the material that is superimposed on your own, until TSR gave them a sort of recognition on the copyright page. Which TSR has readily done, resulting in the second press (Å ¢ Å,~ "with thanks! Å, Å,~), who added this line to Å ¢ Å,~ Å" Credit and the awards °: thanks also to Chaosium, Inc. For permission to use the material found in Cthulhu's Mythos and Mythos Melniboneean. However, released the Muck-A-Mucks to TSR to extend this credit to a competitor, so from the third press (still listed as a first edition!) The compromising Pantheons had been amazed.
