Another way to open File Explorer is to use Task Manager. Although redundant, you can also open File Explorer by navigating to your Windows folder and double-clicking the explorer.exe file. But who knows, maybe you need to add its path to a script youre creating: %WINDIR%\explorer.exe Where is File Explorer? Open it by running explorer.exeTIP: In the path above, I used an environment variable so that the path works no matter on which partition you install Windows.
